#### **Relevance For Public Health**

Public health professionals can use this grey literature checklist to identify Canadian and international organizations with relevant unpublished reports and resources. Searching and synthesizing grey literature can help professionals develop an enriched and comprehensive evidence base to inform decision making.

## **Description**

Developed by the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health (CADTH), <u>Grey Matters: A Practical Search Tool for Evidence-based Medicine</u> is a checklist to use when searching grey literature reports that are not accessible through bibliographic databases. *Grey Matters* is a comprehensive list of Canadian and international government health technology assessment (HTA) websites, health economics resources and health prevalence or incidence databases.

Created by the Information Services team at CADTH, this checklist serves to:

- ensure retrieval of relevant government, evidence-based agency reports that may not be indexed
  in bibliographic databases;
- document the grey literature search process so that is transparent and reproducible; and
- ensure a standard and systematic approach to searching grey literature.

*Grey Matters* includes Canadian and international websites with tips on searching websites and Internet searching.

## Implementing the Tool

#### Who is Involved?

Librarians, project specialists and others involved in searching for information as part of an evidence review or rapid review process would benefit from using this tool.

## Steps for Using Tool

The *Grey Matters* checklist is organized by topic, with drop-down boxes to document success when retrieving grey literature reports. Topics include:

- health technology assessment agencies
- health economics
- clinical practice guidelines
- drug and device regulatory approvals
- advisories and warnings
- drug class reviews
- clinical trials
- Canadian drug formularies
- databases (free)
- statistics
- miscellaneous (Internet searching, open access journals, ethics)

These summaries are written by the NCCMT to condense and to provide an overview of the resources listed in the Registry of Methods and Tools and to give suggestions for their use in a public health context.
